### Draft budget 2024-25 on exhibition

Pyrenees Shire Council's Draft Budget 2024-2025 has been released for public comment after a special Council meeting last week.

Pyrenees Mayor Cr Robert Vance said the budget is fiscally responsible, balancing a determination to maintain current services against static revenue streams and high inflation while also considering financial sustainability.

### Avoca drainage maintenance
