Pyrenees Mayor Cr Robert Vance said the budget is fiscally responsible, balancing a determination to maintain current services against static revenue streams and high inflation while also considering financial sustainability.

ROADWORKS AND PROJECTS

Avoca drainage maintenance

Avoca drainage upgrades are well advanced, and Council expects there to be little impact on motorists, residents and pedestrians.

Caramuir Road, Nerring culvert works

Upgrade work on the Caramuir Road culvert is underway. Works include the extension of the existing culvert, road reinstatement, and installation of guard railing. The road will be closed during works, please follow the detour signs. We apologise for any inconvenience.

Roadworks on Pittong-Snake Valley Road

Sealing is now complete on Pittong Snake Valley Road near Cochrane Drive.

Roadworks on Trawalla-Waterloo Road

Construction is almost complete on Trawalla Waterloo Road near Racecourse Road. Pavement works have started and will cause some traffic delays. Sealing is complete and line marking will happen shortly.

Infrastructure repairs

Repair work continues on infrastructure damaged by the October/November 2022 flood events. There is more work

to do on roads, culverts, floodways and bridges. We thank you for your patience during these works.
